UNESCO Prize for Girls' and Women's Education

Call for nominations 2019

Deadline: 28 May 2019

The UNESCO Prize for Girls' and Women's Education honours outstanding and innovative practices advancing **girls' and women's education**, and in turn, improving the quality of their lives. Established in 2015, it is funded by the Government of the People's Republic of China and consists of two US \$50,000 awards to help further the work of laureates in this field. The Prize directly contributes to Sustainable Development Goals 4 and 5.

Who can nominate?

Governments of UNESCO Member States via their National Commissions and Permanent Delegations to UNESCO, and **Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs) in official partnership with UNESCO** can make **up to 3 nominations**.

Self-nominations are not accepted.

Who can be nominated?

Individuals, institutions or organizations advancing girls' and women's education through an **established and ongoing** project or programme which has been running for at least two years. How to nominate?
